Miss Neeves, Mrs Best and I have visited many of the homes and families of the new Foundation intake. These visits give the opportunity for parents to ask questions and for the children to establish the relationship between home and school, which develops so rapidly at Landulph to create the perfect environment for learning. Together with the transition sessions, we have made sure that the children are all ready to smoothly join us in September.

The current Foundation parents had an opportunity to meet with Miss Neeves this week for an additional parents' evening, now that the children have been in school for nearly a whole year. I know how positive these meetings have been and again have provided more opportunities to ask questions and solve problems. Reverend Chris visited for his final assembly of the year. We aim to continue these links with the church next year to develop the knowledge and understanding of our children. He makes the assemblies entertaining for the children whilst ensuring important messages are understood.

Class 1 and 2 had a fascinating free lobster visit from a hatchery in Padstow. The children were able to see the different stages of a baby lobster, their skeleton and how they shed their shell in order to grow.

### Landulph School Wraparound Care

We are delighted to share with you that we have successfully appointed an Afterschool Club Manager and an Afterschool Club Assistant to start our new club in September. Jackie Johnson joins us with huge experience of working with children in a variety of jobs; she will take on the manager role. Kerry Thomas, one of our lunchtime supervisors, will take on the role as assistant. Both members of staff hugely impressed us on the interview day with ideas about creating a successful club, allowing more families the support they need to be successful working parents. The breakfast club will also be extended to start at 7.45am, due to popular demand. Both clubs will be open to children in all year groups, including Foundation.

Both clubs will begin on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September and will run every day of the school year, excluding the INSET/Staff training days. We would appreciate families booking in to all school clubs by the Friday before the week ahead to allow the staff to plan for high quality provision, meeting the needs of all the children present. Any child who is entitled to Free School Meals will be able to use both the breakfast club and the extended hours club at no charge. Please contact us or visit our school website for detailed information in respect of Free School Meals. We are currently looking into how the school can accept childcare vouchers so if any employers offer this service, please let the school know if you plan to use these so that we can establish if these can be accepted.
